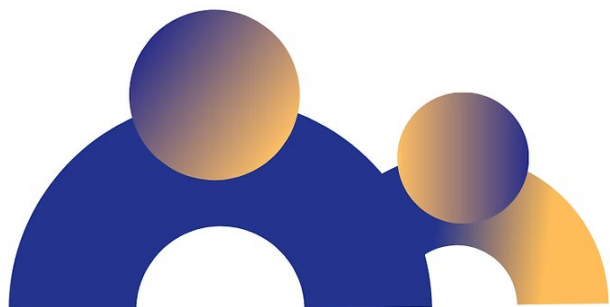
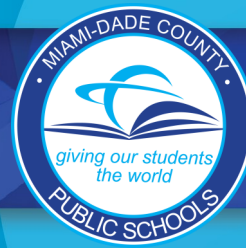

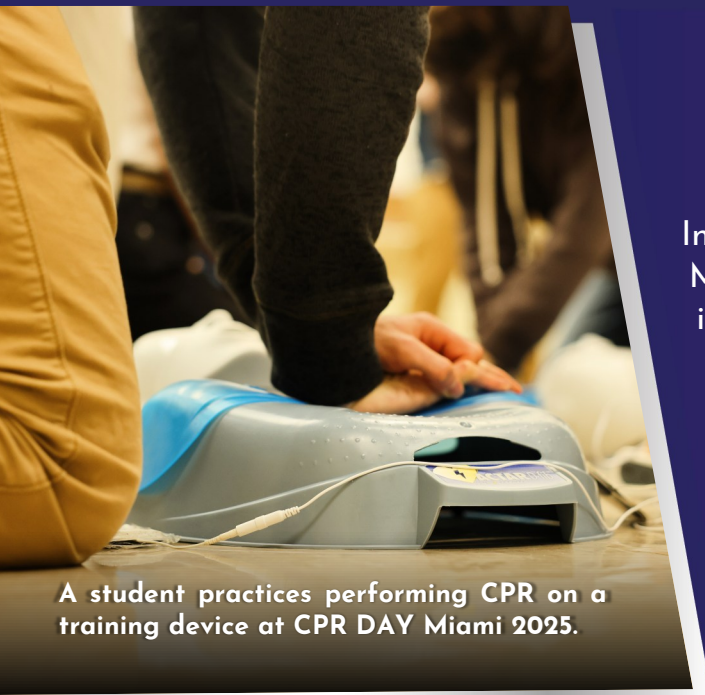
ABOVE & BEYOND

Running a middle school robotics program is a massive undertaking that requires a unique blend of grit and vision. Ms. Krigger embodies both. Her dedication to her students sets a new standard for what it means to be an educator in the 21st century.

Innovation by the Dozen (and a Half)

Palm Springs North K-8 Center unveiled a redesigned, technology-rich Innovation Space with an Active Floor and new furniture in an open area where students can engage in creative group activities. There is also a Makerspace area, which includes robotics, arts and crafts, hands-on technology, as well as board games. Flip-and-nest tables, which can be used for classroom instruction and then stored when not in use, are also included. In addition, local tech company Dade Technology Solutions donated 50 laptops and two 3D printers.

The initiative, which is creating 18 Innovation Spaces for middle school students over the course of two years, is supported by a \$2 million partnership between M-DCPS, the College Football Playoff Foundation, the 2026 Miami Host Committee, and the Orange Bowl Committee.
